

# RiverRun hosts night of music for housing-related nonprofits

## *Elsa Cross to perform at event Wednesday*

PORTSMOUTH — RiverRun Bookstore will host a night of music with Elsa Cross called "A Home for Everyone" to benefit housing-related nonprofits in the area.

Tom Holbrook, owner of RiverRun, felt the partnership was a great first step in creating new community partnerships. "Now more than ever, the idea of giving back what you can and it doesn't take much, needs to take hold in our community. As a small business in downtown Portsmouth, RiverRun is connected to the affordable housing issue in so many ways, we're very proud to have done our own small part this past year."
